Steps to Add Sample Models:

1. Download the Sample Model File:

1. Click on the link to download a sample model file.
2. Save the file to your computer. By default, the model file will be saved in your downloads folder.

2. Upload the Sample Model into Comparion:

1. Select the target workgroup.
2. Go to the Manage Models tab or go to Home in the new UI
3. Click the "New from File" button.
4. Select the file you downloaded to upload the model.
